Call for Papers – Emerging Practice

We invite respiratory therapists, as well as our interprofessional colleagues, to submit research exploring the role new and innovative cardiopulmonary practices play in expanding coverage, improving quality, and containing costs in healthcare. Submissions on the topic of emerging practice may:

- Focus on unique, emerging, and expanding roles of respiratory care practitioners in health care environments

- Respond to changing and evolving healthcare needs, including responses to an ageing population, healthcare worker shortages, or advancing models of care such as precision medicine

Two U of T Courses Approved for CSRT CE/CPD Credits

The following courses have been approved for CSRT credits:

Exercise Training in Pulmonary Rehabilitation: A Practical Approach (40 credits): In this 8-week online course, participants will receive practical, skills-based, instruction on exercise testing and training in pulmonary rehabilitation. Learners will administer and interpret the results of various exercise and functional tests, learn about aerobic, resistance, and balance training, as well as prescriptions based on results of exercise tests. This course makes use of online discussions, self-guided practice exercises, case studies, multiple-choice quizzes, and a reflective writing exercise. Functional Assessment: The Six Minute Walk Test for Clinical Researchers and Clinicians (15 credits): This fully online course is designed for both researchers and clinicians, and provides a practical, skills-based, online overview of best practices in administering and interpreting the six-minute walk test, a common outcome measure used with many patients, including cardiorespiratory, neurological, and geriatric populations. Statement on Yardstick Assessment Strategies' Response to the Cancellation of the July 9, 2018 CBRC Examination

On Monday, July 9th, 2018 the web-based platform used by the Canadian Board for Respiratory Care's (CBRC) third party provider, Yardstick Assessment Strategies (Yardstick), experienced a system failure resulting in cancellation of the examination. Many CSRT members were impacted by this occurrence.

In a recent communication, officials at Yardstick Assessment Strategies (Yardstick) indicated that they will be reimbursing only a portion of the original full examination fee to those who attempted to write the exam on July 9, 2018. That communication indicated that Yardstick "had hoped to refund the entire exam fee, but since the remaining portion of this fee is money that we collect and remit for others, we are not able to refund those amounts" as had been promised in an earlier communication to exam writers.

The CSRT does not administer the national RT credentialing exam. However, it does recognize the emotional and financial hardships that the technical system failure and subsequent exam cancellation and rewrite has created for many of its members. As the national body representing the interests of respiratory therapists, the CSRT has sent a letter to Yardstick indicating that it expects the company to reconsider this decision and fully reimburse candidates. The letter from CSRT CEO, Dr. Andrew West, also indicated that the CSRT believes it is necessary for Yardstick to provide examination writers with a detailed description of the criteria being used to determine the allowance of all reimbursable expenses as a measure to ensure transparency, awareness, and fairness for everyone involved.
