In addition to his duties with Trudell Health Solutions Inc. as a clinical applications specialist in PFT and CPET, Mr. Nadreau teaches at Laval University at the Faculty of Medicine and at the Department of Kinesiology, mainly for graduate courses in connection with the Specialized graduate diploma (DESS) in Clinical Kinesiology. He also has extensive experience as an external consultant for numerous international multicenter studies in respirology and cardiology.
